The total lot owners present and proxies received did not meet the 30% (156) required for a quorum. The final total of attendees and proxies was 79. Items discussed from the floor

- 1. Several members expressed the need to Increase efforts to control the deer population. This is an ongoing effect, but for it to be effective we must be able to hunt on properties throughout the Springs. If you are interested in helping, please contact Alan Hoppensteadt, Ed Carlson or Alex Roland.
- 2. The issue of parking on roadsides and the need for a parking area on the common property we own just off Rocky Cove Lane on Minstral Lane was discussed. These are items that the board will consider in 2011.
- 4. The need for a sanitation facility at the boat launch area.
- 5. The need for improved security at the emergency road exit gate.
- 6. Concern was expressed about how we can get a quorum at our annual meetings. Discussion included why we can't use the NC Planned Community Act and the possibility of changing the quorum requirements in our covenants (this requires a 67% positive vote). The board will look into options, including a mail vote to change the quorum requirements.
